

## What to expect at Wildlings Forest School

The aim of Forest School is to develop the person as a whole. The outdoor setting coupled with the child-led learning process through small achievable tasks builds self-confidence and esteem, resilience and emotional and social skills. These skills are transferable to other areas of your child's learning.

Early sessions will involve children getting to know the site, Forest School routines and basic safety rules.

As sessions progress over the weeks and months activities will move from leader facilitated to more child-led.

#### Forest School also:

- Develops fine and gross motor skills to stay active and healthy
- Promotes co-operative and group work skills
- Encourages self care and care of others
- Fosters an appreciation and respect for the environment and nature
- Broadens knowledge and understanding of wildlife and natural processes

## A typical Wildlings Forest School session involves:

- Meeting leader at the gate into the Attenborough Arboretum.
- Walking to the Forest School circle.
- Gathering around the Forest School Circle (log seats) to share news, name game and introduction to that session.
- Activities often happen in and around the Forest School circle.
- Alongside suggested leader activities there is time for your child to choose a free-choice activity, explore the site (under your supervision), or follow a seasonal/themed picture/clue/quiz trail.
- Towards the end of each session children will be asked to help with tidying up equipment and resources.
- To close the session, everyone will gather around the Forest School circle to share their experiences, something they made or did or enjoyed or will have time for a quiet reflection.
- Before walking back to the gate and heading home.

### **Activities could include:**

- Natural art
- Knots and lashing
- Shelter building
- Fire lighting and/cooking
- Wildlife discovery bug hunts, pond dipping, animal tracking
- Plant and tree investigations and identification
- Climbing and balancing
- Hand tool use to make items e.g. musical instruments, jewellery, decorative objects
- Building bug homes and bird feeders

#### **Facilities and Access:**

Toilets in classroom building - 1 unisex and 1 disabled unisex Handwashing available in toilets and at Forest School Circle

Main paths are surfaced (crushed limestone/wooden boardwalk); other paths/surfaces are grass/mud Benches around site and log seats in main activity area Pond on site - Deep Water

## What to wear/bring:

As all sessions happen outside please see suggested clothing for you and your child/ren below to wear/bring depending on the weather and season.

# **Adults at Wildlings Education Groups and Activities**

Please follow these guidelines to help keep our groups and activities a fun and safe place for children and young people.

- Sign in with the Wildlings Education leader on arrival and Sign out when leaving the group session or activity.
- Children must be supervised by their accompanying adult throughout the Wildlings Education group sessions/activities.
- Accompanying adults are responsible for the behaviour of the child/ren in their care do not discipline other people's children.
- Behave in a way that sets good examples for the children and young people
- Listen to and follow any safety briefings and instructions provided by Wildlings Education leader.
- Only trained assistance dogs are allowed to attend Wildlings Education groups/activities.
- Only take photos with permission of the Wildlings Education leader and the adult accompanying child or young person.
- Avoid touching a child/young person in a way that could be misunderstood
- Use appropriate language no swearing or suggestive language or gestures
- Avoid being alone with any child/young person (except the child/young person in your care)
- Do not smoke/vape during the group sessions or attend under the influence of alcohol or other non-prescription drugs.
- Be alert to and avoid anything that has potential to cause an accident or injury.
- Inform the Wildlings Education Leader aware of any safety issues/concerns as soon as they
  occur, including broken or damaged equipment/resources or unsafe environment or behaviour.
- Inform the Wildlings Education Leader if you have any concerns regarding child safety or welfare.
- Enjoy your time at Wildlings Education Groups and Activities.
